Northwest Iowa Community College Will Host a Film Screening and Discussion with the Film Maker of the Documentary “*abUSed: The Postville Raid*”

Northwest Iowa Community College in Sheldon will be hosting a film screening of the documentary “*abUSed: The Postville Raid*” and a public discussion with the filmmaker Luis Argueta at 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 12, in Building C room 328. The film was written and produced by Luis Argueta, Producer/Director.

The film, “*abUSed: The Postville Raid*,” is a documentary about the largest, most expensive Immigration Customs Enforcement (ICE) raids in the history of the United States. By weaving together the personal stories of the individuals, the families, and the town directly affected by the events of May 12, 2008, in Postville, Iowa, the film presents the human face of immigration.
