If you have a disability or health-related need and require testing accommodations, please let the instructor at orientation know. The coordinator or an instructor will help guide you in requesting accommodations through ETS (the maker of HiSET). The approval process can take six weeks or more (once ETS has received the application), so be sure to allow enough time.

Pages 15 – 20 of the HiSET Test Taker Bulletin 2014 describes the accommodation request process in more detail and includes the form that will need to be filled out and sent to ETS.
